Thank you for your email and I apologize for the delay in response. I am currently experiencing a high email and phone call volume and appreciate your patience as I work through this.

The change to the portfolio process will not impact the MCC application at this time. Those applicants will still be able to submit CCEs with their other training as they have in the past. For the ACC and PCC credentials, they are still able to submit CCE training towards those credentials, however, the applicant will need to show how each training that is accredited as a CCE provided them with comprehensive coach training that includes the ICF definition of coaching, Code of Ethics and Core Competencies, and is organized in a scope and sequence that encourages the growth of the coach.

Can you clarify the following:

I understand the desire to distinguish ACTP and ACSTH providers, especially for first credential coach-specific training. And that CCE's are for continuing education, not for first credential.

Does that mean that for a coach who has their ACC and is now applying for their PCC. Can they use some Core Competency CCE's to make up any shortfall they may have toward 125 hours of coach-specific training? Same if coach has PCC and is now applying for MCC?
